



SYLLABUS: FST 4191 INTERNSHIP/EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Instructor

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The intention of an internship is to give you "real world" experience in the food industry. It is also to help you learn how to interact, learn and excel in the work environment.

Students majoring in Food Science, Food Business Management and Culinary Science must procure an internship/experiential learning opportunities. This usually is in the food industry, though research in a laboratory is acceptable, especially if a student intends to pursue research in a career or graduate school. Once completed, students typically enroll in this credit the next semester, though concurrent experience and enrollment is possible.

The assignment for your internship credit is to give a presentation about your internship.

The presentation should be 15-20 minutes, and you should dress as you would for an interview. I want you to present where you worked, what you did for your internship and what skills you learned that you can use anywhere in the future - how to work with a strict manager, how to cooperate with co-workers, how you learned to do your job/research etc. I expect a powerpoint presentation - it should be uploaded into the dropbox on Carmen at least the day before your scheduled presentation.

You are welcome to attend any and all of the other presentations, but you are not required and your attendance will not affect your grade.
